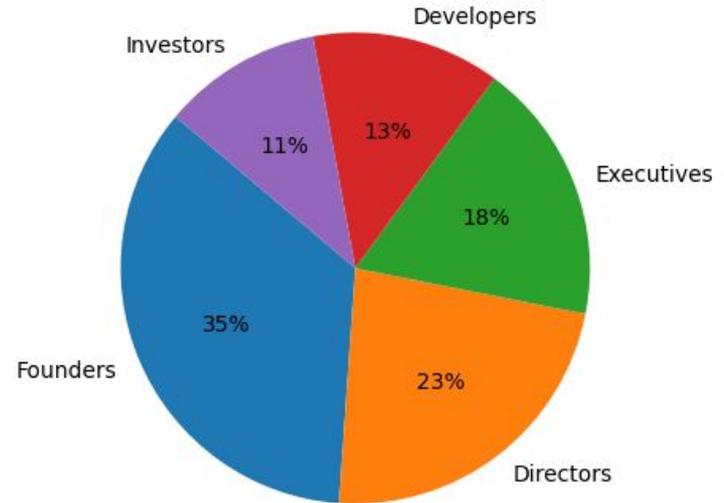

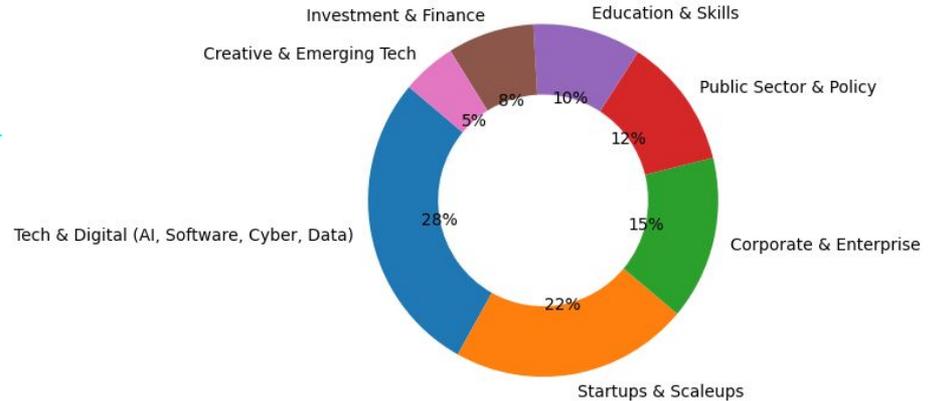

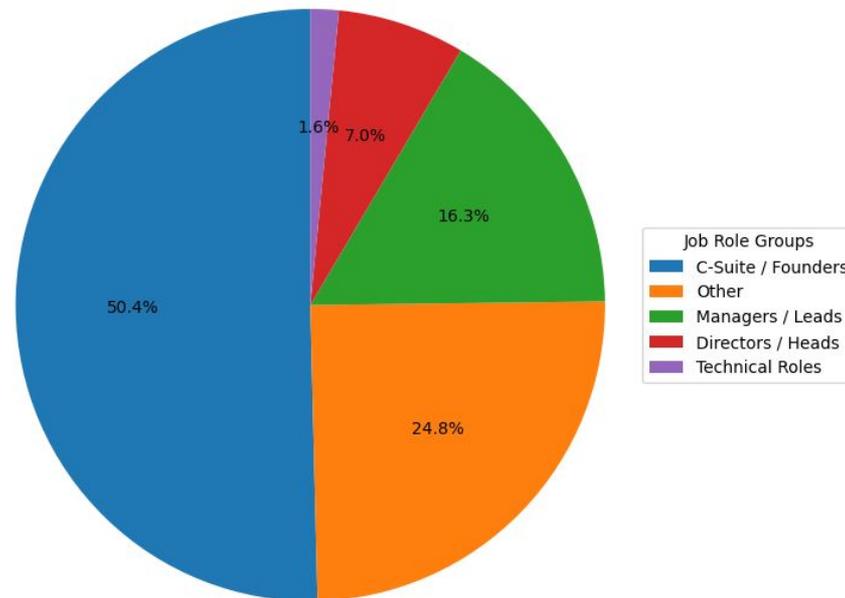

- Significant Director and Head-of-Function representation

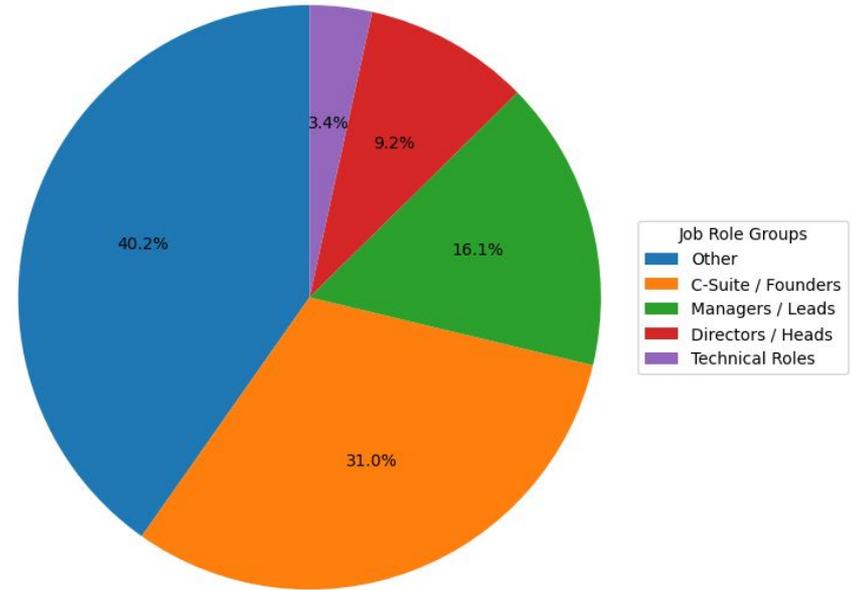


Digital Skills Symposium

Audience profile: Broad, skills-focused mix

- Largest share from **operational and delivery roles**
- Balanced presence of managers and senior leaders

The Digital Skills Symposium successfully reached a **workforce and skills-delivery audience**, rather than being leadership-heavy. This indicates strong engagement from those directly responsible for implementing digital skills programmes and training initiatives.

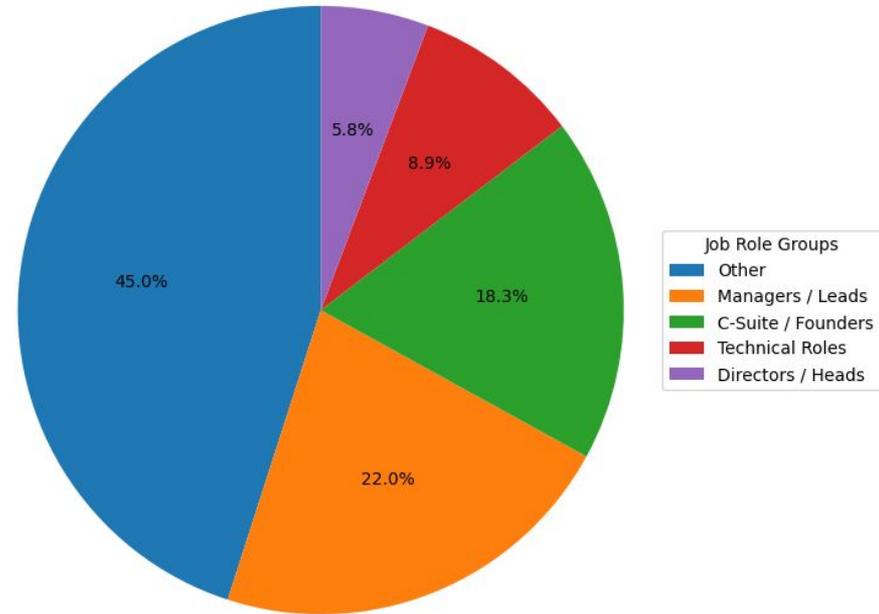


Women In Tech Day

Audience profile: Mid-career and emerging leadership

- Highest proportion of **Managers and Leads**
- Meaningful but lower C-Suite representation

Women in Tech Day is particularly effective at engaging **mid-career professionals and emerging leaders**, a critical cohort for long-term gender equity in tech leadership. The audience profile reflects a strong pipeline-building function.

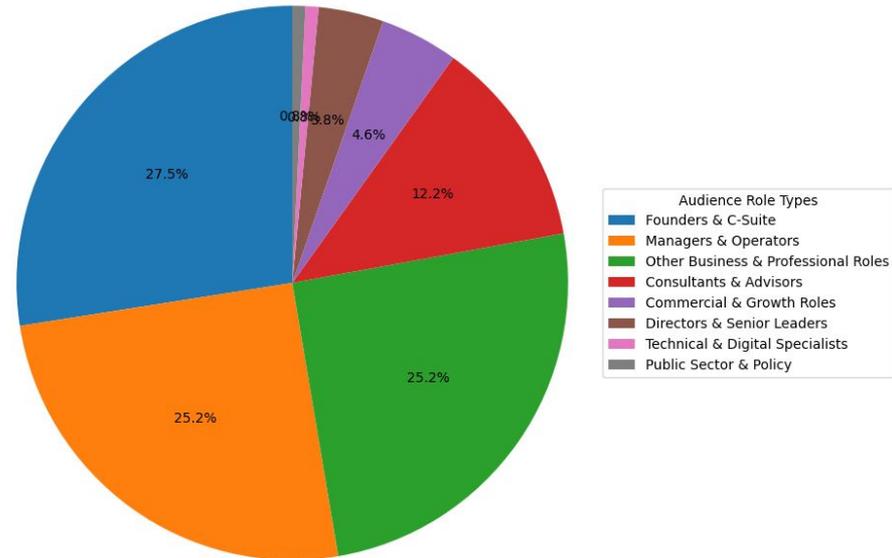


Midlands House

Audience profile: Founder- and operator-led

- Strong combined presence of **C-Suite and Managers**
- Lower director-level representation

Midlands House attracted a highly **execution-focused audience**, dominated by founders and operational leaders. This reflects its role as a space for practical discussion, partnership building, and regional advocacy.

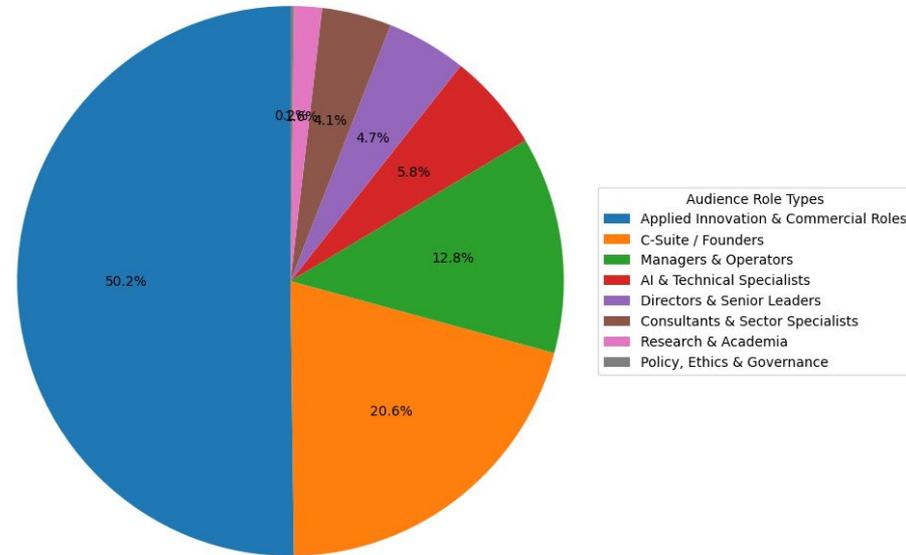


AI Symposium

Audience profile: Broad and interdisciplinary

- Large proportion of roles outside traditional leadership or technical titles
- Moderate senior leadership presence

The AI Symposium attracted a **wide, cross-sector audience**, predominantly applied-innovation audience, with over half of attendees working in commercial, transformation, and AI deployment roles. The diversity of roles suggests strong interest from policy, commercial, and applied innovation communities, not just technologists.

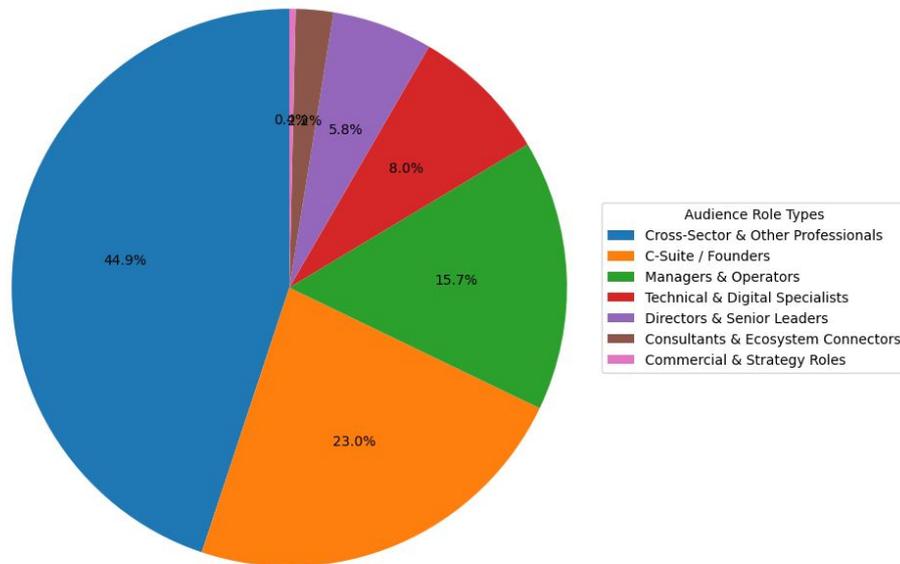


Frontiers Day

Audience profile: Balanced innovation audience

- Mix of founders, managers, and cross-functional professionals
- Limited dominance of any single seniority level

Frontiers Day attracted a highly cross-functional audience, with a significant proportion of attendees working in innovation, transformation, and sector-specific roles that sit outside traditional leadership or technical titles.

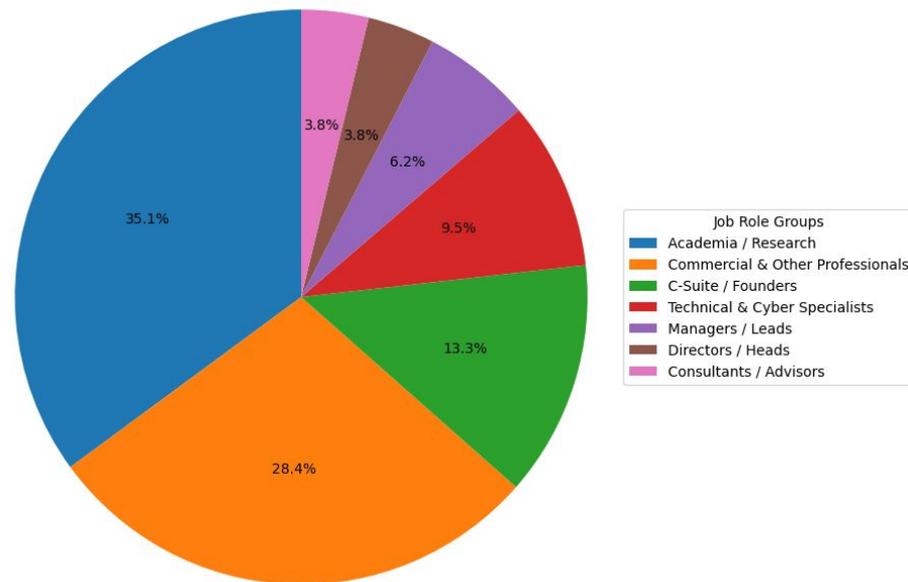


CyberVerse Day

Audience profile: Knowledge- and research-led

- High representation from **academia, research, and commercial practitioners**
- Lower leadership concentration

Cyberverse stands out as a **knowledge-driven event**, with strong academic and specialist participation. This highlights Birmingham Tech Week's ability to convene deep expertise alongside industry.

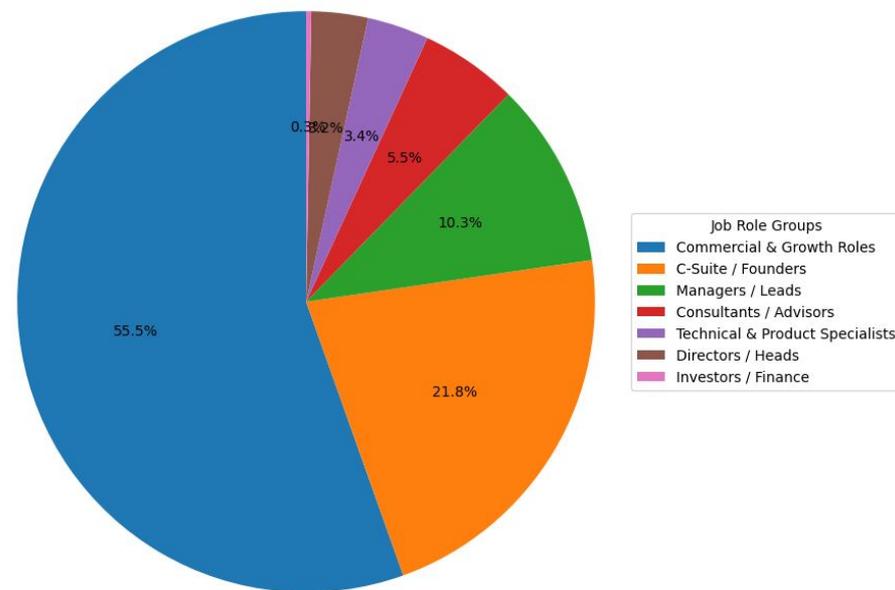


Scale-Up Summit

Audience profile: Commercial and growth-focused

- Majority from **commercial, growth, and founder roles**
- Very limited investor attendance

The Scaleup Summit clearly served **growth-stage businesses**, with a strong emphasis on sales, partnerships, and operational scaling. The low investor presence suggests future opportunity to deepen capital engagement.

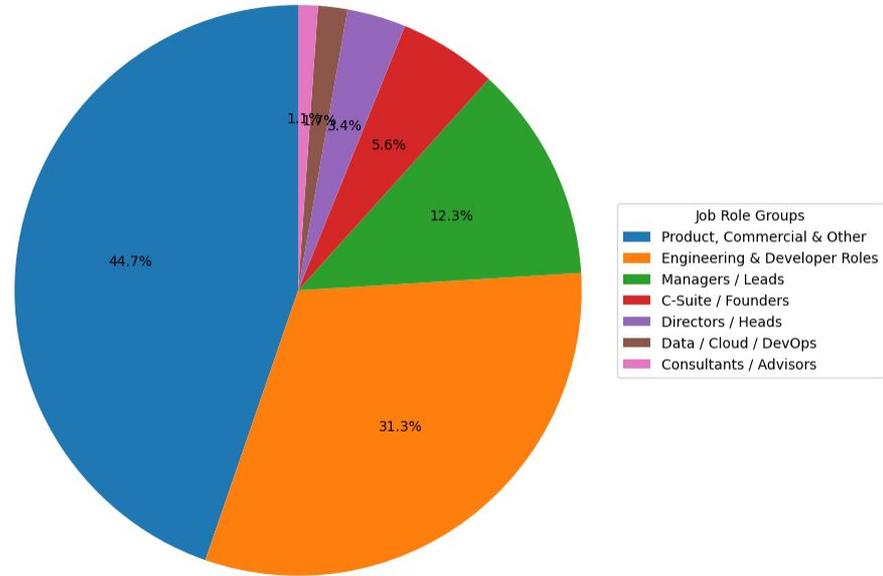


Engineering & Developer Conference

Audience profile: Practitioner-led

- Highest concentration of **engineers and developers**
- Minimal senior leadership presence

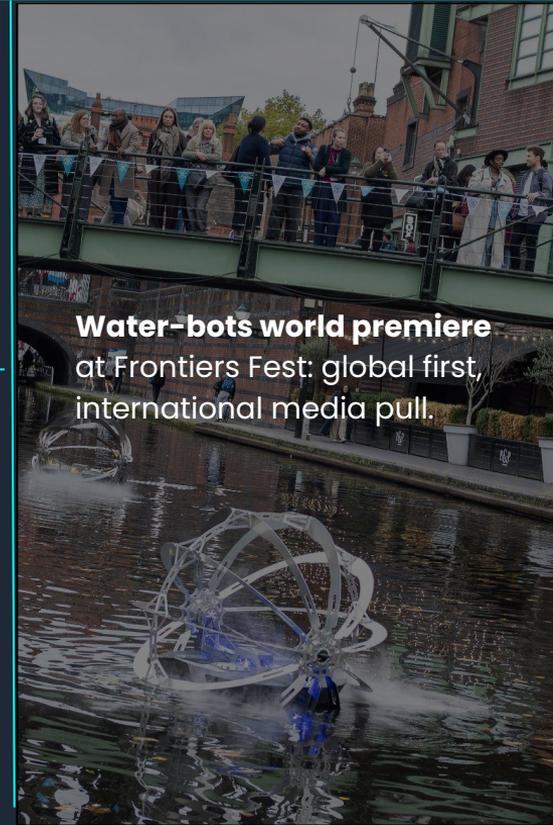
